Short Remarks by H.E. Mr. Yoshitaka Hanada, Ambassador of Japan to Timor-Leste, at the Send-off Ceremony for Youth Exchange Programs On Monday, November 19, 2012

Last but not least, today, we have 3 professional musicians from Japan. They have introduced Japanese culture to the Timorese youths to enhance our bilateral relationship in hope of a long-lasting friendship. They will liven up this Send-off ceremony by their music performance.
